




## Repository Data Model for Archival Materials

## Object Description

Object level metadata captures information about the intellectual and / or physical objects that are being represented in the repository. This information applies to all digital surrogates.



### Accession Number

RDF TERM: AAT:ACCESSION ([HTTP://VOCAB.GETTY.EDU/AAT/300312355](http://VOCAB.GETTY.EDU/AAT/300312355))

REPEATABLE: YES

REQUIRED: No

The primary accession number associated with the record. For images and content that contains references to multiple objects repeat the field as needed.

## Primary UUID

RDF TERM: DC:IDENTIFIER ([HTTP://PURL.ORG/DC/TERMS/IDENTIFIER](http://purl.org/dc/terms/identifier))

REPEATABLE: No

REQUIRED: Yes

The primary identifier for the collection or item. This identifier will be generated automatically by the repository during ingest and should be persistent.

## Related URI

RDF TERM: DC:URI ([HTTP://PURL.ORG/DC/TERMS/URI](http://purl.org/dc/terms/uri))

REPEATABLE: Yes

REQUIRED: No

URIs for related content such as Collections Online or other resources that also describe the record

## Spatial Coverage

RDF TERM: DC:SPATIAL ([HTTP://PURL.ORG/DC/TERMS/SPATIAL](http://purl.org/dc/terms/spatial))

REPEATABLE: Yes

REQUIRED: No

Locations associated with the resource which should include places where the resource was taken, places described in the item, and related locations. Use of a controlled vocabulary is strongly preferred (such as LCSH, GeoNames, or TGN).

RDF TERM: DC:DATE

REPEATABLE: YES

REQUIRED: NO

Date associated with the intellectual object. This is primarily intended for capturing the time that the event occurred rather than the date(s) that any actions were taken such as conservation.

The ISO8601 format is highly recommended.

RDF TERM: DC:ABSTRACT

REPEATABLE: NO

REQUIRED: NO

A description of the event(s) taking place in the intellectual object. This could be used in place of the description field.

REPEATABLE: NO

REQUIRED: YES

Summary of the event captured by the intellectual object. This should be a succinct description rather than a lengthy version.

RDF TERM: DC:PROVENANCE (<http://purl.org/dc/terms/provenance>)

REPEATABLE: No

REQUIRED: Yes

Provenance information for the intellectual object

## Language

RDF TERM: DC:LANGUAGE

REPEATABLE: Yes

REQUIRED: No

Language(s) used within the intellectual object. This should not describe the metadata encoding but the actual item itself – such as the contents of the book.

Follow the ISO 639-1 standard for encoding.

## Title

RDF TERM: DC:TITLE

REPEATABLE: No

REQUIRED: Yes

A primary title for the intellectual object such as the name of the work or a description of the content. For images without any provided metadata use the file name as the title.
